Hunter and Equitation Divisions

Warm up: (A, B) Open to all. Judged warm-up rounds can be ridden before any class EXCLUDING any Medal or Jumper class.

Leadline: (LLa, LLb) No age limit. Horse or pony must be led/controlled by a qualified horse leader. Entrants may not enter any other classes in the show.

Open Hunter: (1,2,3) Open to all. Fence height choice of 2', 2'3", 2'6", 2'9", or 3'. Rounds will be ridden throughout the day as course heights are changed for other divisions. Under saddle class will go before the Pony class starts. Riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

Beginner Hunter and Equitation: (Hunter 39,40,41 Eq. 42,43) Amateurs Only. This division is for entry-level riders only. The purpose of this class is to provide an initial showing experience for individuals. Rider may not enter any other classes at show. The course for this division will be rider choice of four (4) poles on the ground or 18" crossbars set as two (2) lines, one line on each side of ring. The rider will jump once around only. The rider may trot the entire course or trot to the line and canter away. Riders may not canter in to any first fence of a line. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other division is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Intermediate Hunter and Equitation: (Hunter 34, 35, 36 Eq. 37,38) Amateurs Only. The course will be 18" crossbars with diagonal lines or a single fence present including flowers. The rider may trot the entire course, trot to the line and canter away, or canter the entire course. On the flat, the riders will be asked to show at the walk and trot in both directions. No cross-entry into any other division is allowed by that horse/rider combination.

Baby Green Hunter: (31-33) Open to all riders, limited to horses in their first or second year of showing. The courses are simple with seven (7) or eight (8) small 18" crossrails jumping into lines and verticals jumping out. On the flat the riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot, and optional canter in both directions. Choosing not to canter will not be penalized.

18" Hunter and Equitation: (Hunter 26,27,28 Eq. 29,30) Amateurs Only. The courses are simple with seven (7) or eight (8) small 18" verticals. Entrants are encouraged to canter the courses. On the flat the riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot and canter in both directions.

Adult Hunter: (23,24,25) Riders must be 18 or older. Amateurs Only. The jumps will include 18" verticals jumping in and 2' verticals jumping out. No oxers or fill except for flowers. Riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot and canter in the flat class.

Pony Hunter: (14,15,16) Open to small, medium or large ponies. Amateurs only. Fence height choice of 2' or 2'3" regardless of pony size. Rounds will be ridden through the day as heights change for other divisions. Riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class.

Very Low Hunter: (17,18,19) Amateurs Only. Rider choice of 2' or 2'3", to be judged together. Small oxers no wider than the height of the fence. Riders will be asked to show at the walk, trot and canter in the under-saddle class. **Points earned at April Season

Opener in 2' Hunter and Modified Hunter divisions will be applied to this division for 2021 year end awards**

Education Equitation (2'-2'3") and Scholarship Equitation (2'6"-2'9"):

(7,8): Amateurs only. Scholarship class. Riders may choose fence heights. Rounds will be ridden throughout the day as course heights are changed for other divisions. Open to all amateur riders regardless of age or membership. However, riders wishing to compete for the scholarship must meet the following requirements:

- Must be in 9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade
- Must ride in a minimum of 4 scholarship divisions during the 2021 show season
- Member in good standing with NWAHJA, and completed a minimum of 40 volunteer hours (as detailed in application)
- Grade Point Average of 2.5 or higher
- Essay, and letter of recommendation from trainer or teacher due Dec. 1, 2021

NWAHJA Hunter: (4.5,6) Amateurs Only. Fences not to exceed 2'6".

Low Hunter: (10,11,12) Amateurs Only. Rider may choose fence height of 2'9" or 3' to be judged together.

Medal Classes: Junior and Amateurs only. Equitation classes. The rider must be a member of NWAHJA in good standing and the horse must be owned by a member of NWAHJA in good standing to enter this class. This is an equitation class over a course that is moderately more difficult than a typical hunter course. The course stresses competent and accurate riding skills. The top four riders after the 1st round may be called back for additional testing. All riders accumulating 13 points or more in their medal division through the show season will qualify for the medal finals held at the NWAHJA Year-End Show. There will be qualifying medal classes held at the Year-End Show with the finals held after. Two (2) riders are required for the class to fill.

2' Medal: (22) 2' fences, may have oxers with maximum spread of 2'. USEF Tests 1-6 may be used for work-off at judge's discretion.

NWAHJA Medal: (9) Fences 2'6". USEF Tests 1-13 may be used for a work-off at the judge's discretion.

Progressive Medal: (13a,13b) Rider may choose from heights 2'9" or 3'. At any time during the show season, the rider may choose a different height, lower or higher. The course must also include at least three of the following: bending lines, narrow jump (6'8"), rollback turn, fence at the end of the ring, long approach to a single jump. To be judged on style and execution. Upon completion of the over fences phase, all riders will be asked to come back to the ring for a flat phase on the same horse. Riders will be asked to show at the working walk, working trot sitting, working trot rising, and working canter. Top 4 riders after both phases may be asked for additional testing, with judge's choice of course and USEF Tests 1-19. To be judged on the rider's position, seat, and the correctness and the effect of the aids. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies. Riders may not cross enter into any other medal class.

Jumper Classes and Divisions

Puddle Jumper: 2'3"-2'6": (44,45) Table II, Sec 2(b): The first round and first jump-off, if any, are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor with a clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon audible signal to begin his/her round, the competitor is responsible for adhering to the 45 second rule as per JP134.3 A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or after the tone) will be considered to have retired from the jump-off. If there are clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults. It is recommended that no more than ten numbered obstacles be included in the first round when the class is scored under this table. Table II, Sec 2(b): Cross-Entry of horse/rider into Future Jumpers only.

Future Jumper: 2'6"-2'9": (46,47)
Table II, Sec 2(b): Same as above.

Training Jumper: 2'9"-3': (48,49)
Table II, Sec 2(b): Same as above.

Open Jumper: 3'-3'3": (50,51)
Table II, Sec 2(b): Same as above.

Special Classes for Summer Classic

JC. \$250 2'6"-2'9" Jumper Classic II.2a

Table II, Sec 2(a): The first round and first jump-off are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. After all exhibitors have completed their first round, competitors who went clean in the first round will return to the ring, and upon audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. The competitor is responsible for adhering to the 45 second rule as per JP134.3. It is recommended that no more than ten numbered obstacles be included in the first round when the class is scored under this table. Must have shown in at least one jumper class to qualify for the Classic. The Jumper Classic will follow the Table II, Sec 2(a) format as outlined above. Prize Money Distribution 1st: \$75 2nd: \$55 3rd: \$38 4th: \$33 5th: \$26 6th: \$23. Ribbons 1-10th place.

HD1. \$500 2'6" Jr/Am Hunter Derby Entry fee \$50

Open to amateurs only. Hunter Derby courses are designed to more closely resemble the hunt field, with fewer ground lines, taller, narrower fences, hedges and more. The approaches to jumps vary and are completely negotiable. Riders are rewarded for choosing more difficult routes which can even include optional jump heights. A two round format will be used with all those without a major fault (rail or refusal) returning for the second round. The first round will be a Classic Hunter style course with 10 obstacles including 3 option jumps. First round scores will be based on each entry's numerical score plus one bonus point for each option jump completed without faults. The second round will be run as a Handy Hunter course of a set of 6 obstacles with 2 option jumps and choices such as clever jump approaches, hand galloping a jump, trotting a small jump, halting, unrelated distances. Second round scores will be based on each entry's numerical score plus 1 bonus point for each option jump completed, plus possible 0-10 points for overall handiness. Scores from the two rounds will be combined. A tie for first place will

be broken by a third Classic round. No schooling of the Derby course will be allowed. Prize Money Distribution: 1st: \$150 2nd: \$110 3rd: \$75 4th: \$60 5th: \$55 6th: \$50. Ribbons 1-10th place.

HD2. \$500 3' Open Hunter Derby Entry fee \$50
Open to all. Same description as above.

HC. \$250 2' Jr/Am Hunter Derby Entry fee \$40

Open to amateurs only. Same description as above. Prize Money Distribution 1st: \$75 2nd: \$55 3rd: \$38 4th: \$33 5th: \$26 6th: \$23.

EQC. NWAHJA Equitation Challenge Entry fee \$20 in addition to division fee.

Open to all junior, amateur, children's and adult riders competing in classes at this show. Must be a NWAHJA member. This class comprises four phases, all to be judged on horsemanship skills. Each phase will receive a numerical score and all phase scores are totaled for the final overall score. Ribbons are awarded from 1st-6th in each phase and 1st-10th for the combined total scores.

Individual phases may be entered for \$15/class. The four sections are:

EQCa (2'6" divisions and up) / **EQCe** (divisions below 2'6") **Over Fences Phase**
Points from rider's equitation division over fences class.

EQCb (2'6" divisions and up) / **EQCf** (divisions below 2'6") **Flat Phase**
Points from rider's equitation division flat class

EQCc (2'6" divisions and up) / **EQCg** (divisions below 2'6"). **Written Phase**
A multiple-choice exam testing knowledge of basic horsemanship skills.

EQCd (2'6" divisions and up) / **EQCh** (divisions below 2'6") **Practicum Phase**
Horse and rider shall be presented to the judge tacked to enter the show ring or any other way as specified by the judge. A one on-one interview and review of skills involving horsemanship and general equine knowledge will be demonstrated.

Note: this class does not count toward maximum class totals.

AA, BB, CC, DD, EE, FF Handy Hunter Challenge Entry fee \$20

A single handy hunter round to be run immediately after other division over fences classes. Plaque to the winner and ribbons awarded 1-6th place. Handy Hunter rounds may include a bending line, rollback turn, trot jump, halt, or walk-through. (AA. 2'6", BB. 2'9", CC. 2'3", DD. 18", EE. Baby Green 18", FF. X-rails)

GG. No-Stirrup Equitation on the Flat Entry fee \$20

Equitation on the flat. Open to any rider entered in another equitation on the flat class at this show. Riders should remove stirrups from saddle prior to entering the arena. Walk, trot, and canter to be shown both directions.

HH. Adult Medal Entry Fee \$20

Open to amateur riders aged 18 and up. 18"-2' verticals. The rider must be a member of NWAHJA in good standing and the horse must be owned by a member of NWAHJA in good standing to enter this class. This is an equitation class over a figure 8 course that is moderately more difficult than a typical hunter course. The course stresses competent and accurate riding skills. The top four riders after the 1st round may be called back for additional testing. USEF Tests 1-6 may be used for work-off at judge's discretion.

Best Turnout Award

Three prizes, one each to be awarded Friday, Saturday, and Sunday to the best turned out horse/rider pair at the judge's discretion.

Rules and Guidelines

1. Proper show attire required. ATSM/SEI protective headgear required when mounted.
2. One-year negative Coggins is REQUIRED and will be checked upon arrival.
3. To help us ensure that everyone is checked in and has signed a release, please wear your number during schooling!
4. All divisions are pinned through 8th place. Ribbons will be awarded for Champion and Reserve Champion. Only horses receiving points over fences are to receive under saddle points toward determining champion and reserve champion of each division. ALL year end awards are 1st through 8th, no matter the division.
5. A horse/rider combination may only cross enter divisions with fence heights of a six (6) inch difference. This includes flat/under saddle classes, jumper classes excluded.
6. A horse/pony may not be ridden in more than 11 individual classes per show day. This limit does not apply to any "challenge" classes or the leadline division.
7. In the event that a division does not fill (3 or more riders) and cannot be combined with another division, the class will run with half points being awarded. Medal classes require only two (2) entries to fill.
8. Entry into one over fences class in a division is prohibited. Riders must enter the whole division or only the under saddle/flat class.
9. The One Minute Rule will be enforced at all times. A rider will have one (1) minute to enter the arena when called or be disqualified in that class. Out of respect for other competitors and the judge, this rule is not up for discussion. Be prepared!
10. The NWAHJA Show Steward is on duty for show safety, management, schooling, and questions. Please do not approach the judge during the show.
11. Any horse or pony known to kick must wear a red ribbon in its tail as a warning.
12. A formal request from a rider or trainer to view the judge's card can be made to the Show Steward. The rider and trainer must wait until after the last class of the day to speak with the judge.
13. It is a NWAHJA policy that ANY help or encouragement from the ringside by adult guardians or instructor/trainer is prohibited.
14. Horses owned by a registered NWAHJA member may receive a year-end award once the horse has competed and received points in that division in a minimum of 2 NWAHJA sanctioned shows during the year.
15. A rider in an equitation or medal class or division may receive a year-end award if the rider has competed in and received points in that class or division at a minimum of 2 NWAHJA sanctioned shows during the year.
16. A rider will not be disqualified for the purposes of this rule if, by virtue of when the rider becomes a member of NWAHJA, the rider competes in and receives points in all shows at which the rider was eligible to accumulate points during the show year.

Please read through the NWAHJA Rule Book to acquaint yourself with class descriptions and other conditions of entry.

Scholarship Opportunities

My Ride Scholarship

Available to any member who is riding in 18" or 2' equitation and:

- Exhibits good sportsmanship
- Rides in at least 4 shows in the YEAR season (18" or 2' equitation)
- Completes at least 10 hours of volunteerism with NWAHJA by November 14th
- Applies to be considered as a candidate by DATE
- Submits essay and letter of recommendation from trainer by December 1st

The recipient of this award will receive all equitation and medal classes at NWAHJA shows for the following season free. Member may not be awarded this scholarship more than two consecutive years in a row.

NWAHJA Education Scholarship

Available to any member who is currently in high school (9th, 10th, 11th or 12th grade) and:

- Rides in a scholarship division in at least 4 shows during 2021
- Has a grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Completes at least 40 volunteer hours as detail in application
- Submits essay and letters of recommendation from trainer and teacher by December 1st.

The recipient of this award will be awarded continuing education at an accredited college or university. Member may not be awarded this honor more than two consecutive years in a row.

Volunteer Hours

In order for a NWAHJA member to be eligible for a year end award, they must volunteer 4 HOURS for the organization over the course of the show season at NWAHJA shows or sponsored events.

Sign up today by contacting our Volunteer Coordinator, Kristen Gemeiner, to set up hours to volunteer. A family member or friend may volunteer for the rider. In the event a member is unable to fulfill their hour requirements, \$50 may be paid to NWAHJA for every unmet hour.

NWAHJA Perpetual Trophies

Best Child Rider on a Pony Award

To be awarded to the amateur NWAHJA member in good standing, ages 17 and under, same pony/rider combination, who has accumulated the most points in divisions with fence heights of 18" verticals or higher. Medal and jumper class points do not apply.

Best Child Rider on a Horse Award

To be awarded to the amateur NWAHJA member in good standing, ages 17 and under, same horse/rider combination, who has accumulated the most points in divisions with fence heights of 18" verticals or higher. Medal and jumper class points do not apply.

Best Amateur Adult Rider Award

To be awarded to the amateur NWAHJA member in good standing, 18 years of age or older, same horse/pony and rider combination, who has accumulated the most points in divisions with fence heights of 18" verticals or higher. Medal and jumper class points do not apply.

Horse of the Year Award

To be awarded to the horse that is leased/owned and ridden by a NWAHJA member or members in good standing, professional or amateur, who has accumulated the most points in hunter divisions with fence heights of 2' or higher.

Pony of the Year Award

To be awarded to the pony that is leased/owned and ridden by a NWAHJA member or members in good standing, professional or amateur, who has accumulated the most points in hunter divisions with fence heights of 2' or higher.

Privately Sponsored Trophies

Serendipity Award

To be awarded to the school horse/pony earning the most points in classes beginning with Beginner Hunter and Equitation and moving up. Multiple riders are acceptable. If a one day show format is used, Open Walk-Trot points will count as Maiden Hunter and therefore count for this award.

Spirit Award

To be awarded to the rider, 17 and under, who has exhibited good sportsmanship and horsemanship skills throughout the year both at horse shows and at their home barn. At the end of the show season, trainers may submit in writing a descriptive paragraph about the exhibitor to the NWAHJA Board. This is not about the number of points accumulated or the number of ribbons won, but about kindness, self-control, generosity, and putting the horse's needs first.

Kit Kalypso Award

To be awarded to the horse or pony ridden by a NWAHJA member in good standing who accumulates the most points in the jumper divisions. This trophy is being offered by Laura McKenzie Duncan of Laurel Manor in remembrance of Kit Kalypso, a horse who was champion in victory and defeat.

Tator Tot Award

To be awarded to the horse/pony rider combination who have accumulated the most points across the Beginner and Intermediate hunter and equitation divisions. This trophy is being offered by Diane Gooderl of Deer Creek Farm in remembrance of the very special school pony, Tator Tot.

General Information & Links

To encourage the retraining of Thoroughbreds into other disciplines upon completion of careers in racing or breeding, The Jockey Club created the Thoroughbred Incentive Program (T.I.P.). T.I.P. has a number of programs geared toward all riders and Thoroughbreds. Generally, all information on T.I.P. programs can be found on our website (tjctip.com) under "TB Owners & Riders".

Eligibility

For purposes of eligibility for all T.I.P. classes and awards, a "Thoroughbred" is defined as any horse that has been registered with The Jockey Club or a foreign Thoroughbred stud book recognized by The Jockey Club. Unregistered horses are not eligible.

T.I.P. Numbers

To participate in T.I.P., owners and riders must obtain a T.I.P. Number. To apply for a T.I.P. number, please visit tjctip.com and click on "My Account". You will need an Interactive Registration™ account to apply for a T.I.P. Number. Interactive Registration™ is a FREE service designed for the use of thoroughbred owners and breeders to transact business electronically with The Jockey Club registry. T.I.P. Numbers are free. The T.I.P. number card should be provided to participating horse shows as proof of eligibility.

■ T.I.P. Numbers are horse/owner specific. If you purchase a horse with a number, you need to get a new T.I.P. Number for the horse under your own account.

■ All riders must be listed on the T.I.P. Number – to add a rider, log into your account and click "Add Rider"

Horse Show Awards

T.I.P. offers sponsorship of Thoroughbred classes and high point awards at approved horse shows in virtually all disciplines, including hunter/jumper, eventing, dressage, Western, polo, polocrosse, and endurance.

Performance Awards

The Performance Awards are T.I.P.'s year end, self-reported Thoroughbred "points program". The Performance Awards are completely self-reported by the Thoroughbred's owner or rider. The Award Year is Dec. 1 - Nov. 30 and all forms are due Dec. 20.

Recreational Riding Program

The Thoroughbred Recreational Riding Incentive Program (TRRIP) is designed to recognize and reward Thoroughbred owners and riders that enjoy recreational riding or driving on a regular basis. There are prizes associated with each hour level, beginning with 25 hours.

Championships

The Jockey Club hosts an all Thoroughbred Championship Horse Show with championship divisions for Hunters, Jumpers, English Pleasure, Dressage and Western Pleasure. T.I.P. offers championship awards for eventing at the United States Eventing Association's American Eventing Championships.

Young Rider and Non-Competition Programs

T.I.P. offers a Young Rider of the Year Award and a Youth Ambassador Program as well as a Thoroughbred of the Year Award which recognizes a Thoroughbred that has excelled in a non-competitive career, such as equine-assisted therapy or police work.

USHJA Outreach Class Specifications

1. All courses must have at least seven jumps
2. Courses should be appropriate for the level of competition.
3. Oxers and combinations are discouraged for any class below 2'6" or .75m
4. Each height may be offered as Open; Junior; Amateur; Pony; split or combined at management's discretion.

- USHJA Outreach .90-.95 m

Any rider may compete in Outreach hunter, jumper, and equitation classes, but riders wishing to earn points and national recognition, must be USHJA free Outreach member or higher.



Competitors with a USHJA free Outreach membership or higher will be eligible to earn year-end awards and rewards in hunters, jumpers and equitation. Rewards for competing in any USHJA Outreach Class (Hunter, Equitation, Jumper) will be based on total points earned. Riders achieving a Bronze, Silver, or Gold point level will be eligible to redeem their points at year-end for items of their choice: USHJA logo wear, Bronze, Silver, or Gold Outreach ribbons or Outreach medallions.

- High point Awards: The highest pointed Gold level rider in each Zone will earn the Golden Back Stage Pass to participate in USHJA National Championship Affiliate Sections, and will be invited to participate in the Grand Prix Show Jumping and Hunter Derby course walks, and educational sessions.
- Trainers Awards. Trainers who are USHJA free Outreach members or higher will be awarded points based on their students competing in Outreach classes (student must be a USHJA free Outreach members or higher). One trainer from each Zone whose riders have earned 100 or more points cumulatively, will be recognized as the USHJA Outreach High Point Trainer.
- Horses Awards. Owners of horses competing in Outreach Competitions and Classes wishing to have their horses earn points towards awards must register their horse with USHJA (\$20/year or \$75 lifetime). Horses are not required to be registered with USHJA or microchipped to compete in Outreach classes.
